Constitution Party of Pennsylvania

No. The Constitution Party does not promote, support, nor want a Theocracy.

The Constitution Party understands both that we were founded on Christian principles and those Christian principles that our country was founded on. The Declaration of Independence states that:

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their **Creator** with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

We have rights because our Creator endowed us with them. These rights are unalienable *because* the Creator endowed, or permanently enriched, us with them. This understanding is fundamental to the protection of our rights. If our rights were not given to us by our Creator, but were merely given by men or by government, they are not unalienable and may be taken away.

The Constitution Party holds these unalienable rights to be sacred and works to protect our God-given rights for everyone. The Party provides candidates who will

work to protect our rights and prevent government from interfering with our rights. Constitution Party candidates also recognize that they are accountable to God for their actions.

The Constitution Party also recognizes the Creator's natural law whereby creation continues to function. It is this Natural Law that science observes. The Constitution Party recognizes the cause-and-effect of Natural Law and promotes the use of science in making sound decisions of governance.

The Constitution Party promotes the founder's principle of the Freedom of Religion. All persons should be free to practice their own religion as their conscience directs them. However, the Constitution Party does not support the "freedom from religion" that some are trying to push on America. The *Freedom From Religion* movement seeks to remove any mention of Christianity from all public places and replace it with other religions e.g. Secularism, Humanism, ect. Since our rights come from our Creator, the

Constitution Party views these attacks as direct attacks on our individual rights.
